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Born in 1965, Arnaud Debussche is a former student of the Ecole Normale Supérieure de Saint-Cloud and followed advanced studies in Mathematics. He received his PhD at the Université d'Orsay in 1989. After a post-doc at Indiana University, he entered the National Center for Scientific Research (CNRS) in 1992 and moved as a full professor in 2000 to the Ecole Normale Supérieure de Rennes.

He is a specialist of Stochastic Partial Differential Equations and obtained various results in the study of stochastic dispersive equations, stochastic Navier-Stokes equations, numerical analysis of SPDEs, singular SPDEs ...

Author of about hundred publications in peer reviewed international journals, he has advised twenty PhD thesis. He was awarded as a junior member of the Institut Universitaire de France in 2006 and then as a senior member in 2018.

He serves on several editorial boards of international journals and is the editor in chief of "Stochastics and Partial Differential Equations: Analysis and Applications".

He chaired the Mathematics Departement of ENS Rennes from 2005 to 2013 and has been Dean of Research at the Ecole Normale Supérieure de Rennes since 2015. From 2012 to 2019, he was Deputy Director of the Lebesgue Center..
