Tristan Buckmaster is a Professor of Mathematics at the University of Maryland. He completed his PhD at the University of Leipzig/Max Planck Institute for Mathematics in the Sciences, Leipzig, Germany in 2014. He then spent three years as a Courant Instructor at New York University. He was appointed an Assistant Professor at Princeton University in 2017 and appointed a Professor at the University of Maryland in 2022.

His main area of interest is partial differential equations with a particular focus on equations related to hydrodynamics. He was awarded the 2019 Clay Research Award, together with Vlad Vicol for their work regarding the non-uniqueness of weak solutions to the Navier-Stokes equations.
