Mihalis Dafermos was born in 1976. He obtained his B.A. from Harvard University in 1997 and his Ph.D. from Princeton in 2001, under the supervision of Demetrios Christodoulou. After spending three years at MIT as a C.L.E. Moore Instructor, he moved to the University of Cambridge in 2004, first as University Lecturer, then from 2006 as Reader, and from 2011 as Professor of Mathematical Physics. Since 2013, he has been Professor of Mathematics at Princeton, and in 2015 he was elected to the Lowndean Chair of Astronomy and Geometry at Cambridge. He is also a distinguished member of the Institute for Applied and Computational Mathematics, FORTH, in Heraklion, Crete. He has received several awards, including the Adams Prize, the Bôcher Prize and the Bodossaki Prize for young Greek scientists. He is a Fellow of the AMS and of the ISGRG. His research focusses on general relativity.
